# **Open Source**

The decisive point of the definition of Open Source is that the **software license** allows the comprehensive, free use of the program, i.e. it grants comprehensive simple rights of use to the software without providing any restriction of the licensee or areas of use, that is, it can be used by anyone for any purpose.

# Why do we need Open Source awareness?

- Comply with legal obligations Get the best benefit out of it:

- Proper planning (timing, budget, risk management)

# **OSADL Open Source Policy Template**

More specifically, the goal of this FOSS policy is to

- create sustainable knowledge about FOSS related processes in our company
- avoid copyright infringement
- provide control about the licensing of our company's intellectual property
- meet customer requirements
- meet the OpenChain<sup>1</sup> specification

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# **OpenChain**

#### **1.0 Program Foundation**

#### 1.1 Policy

A written Open Source policy exists that governs Open Source license compliance of the Supplied Software. The policy must be internally communicated.

#### Verification Material(s):

- □ 1.1.1 A documented Open Source policy.
- □ 1.1.2 A documented procedure that makes Software Staff aware of the existence of the Open Source policy (*e.g.*, via training, internal wiki, or other practical communication method).





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# **OpenChain**

#### 1.3 Awareness

The organization shall ensure that Program participants are aware of:

- a) The Open Source policy;
- b) Relevant Open Source objectives;
- c) Their contribution to the effectiveness of the Program; and
- d) The implications of not following the Program's requirements.





# **Propper planning**

- Open Source related processes (e.g. reviews or clearing processes) need time and budget.
- Reviews are needed in early phases of a project.
- This has to be planned accordingly (for the time-line and the project budget).





# Of what people should be aware of

- Open Source policy
- Copyright law
- Processes
- Existing trainings and training material
- OSS related activities throughout the company
- Memberships (Linux Foundation, OSADL, ...)

# The importance of awareness

- Raising awareness is <u>always</u> the first step
- With very low effort you can reach a lot just by...
  - ...letting people know there are rules to follow
  - ...letting people know about the responsibilities




# First step: Awareness training

- Not more than  $\sim$  90 minutes
- Just cover the important aspects, not the details.
- Ideally for ALL employees
- If possible, re-use existing training infrastructure.

- History and underlying ideas of Open Source
- The value and the importance of Open Source
- Basic aspects of Open Source licensing
- Overview on the Open Source Policy, processes and responsibilities within the company
- Overview on available resources within the company





## **Establish an Open Source culture**

- Apply the key principles of Open Source:
  - Work together
  - Share knowledge





## **Create communities**

- Bring people together
- Moderated community
- A community can be used:
  - to exchange information
  - to work on processes
  - to work on trainings
  - to maintain documents and training material

### Just a sidenote...

- From our experience: Every company that uses Open Source will sooner or later contribute to the Open Source ecosystem.
- By creating communities and establishing an Open Source culture your employees are prepared for this step.
